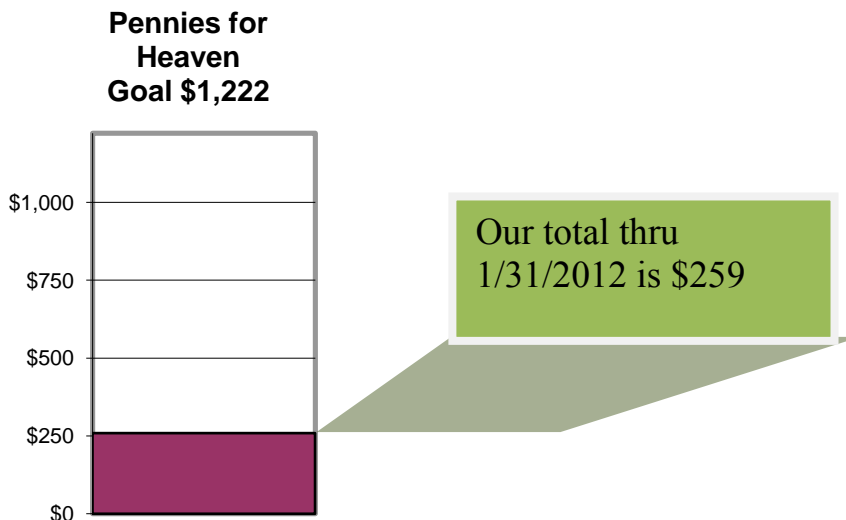

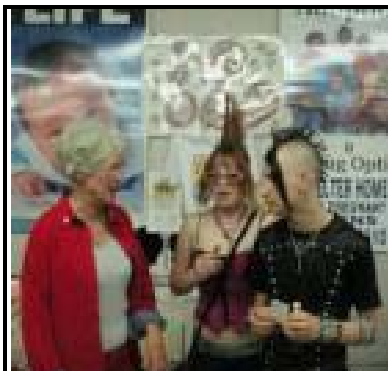



FAITHFUL NAVIGATOR'S MESSAGE

Question: Why is the date April 14, 2012, so important?



Answer: It is the date of the "closest to home" 4th Degree Exemplification this Fraternal year. You may be asking yourself, "What exactly is the Fourth Degree?" The Fourth degree is the highest and most prestigious degree within the Knights of Columbus.

It is a group of outstanding Knights who are dedicated to the service of their Church, their country and our Order. These men are unified in the Fourth Degree to support religious, civic and charitable causes. The motto of the Fourth Degree is Patriotism. Patriotism and pride in one's nation is the driving force behind more than 250,000 Fourth Degree members.

Each Fourth Degree Assembly throughout the country is governed by its own cadre of Officers. The Faithful Navigator is annually elected, along with the Faithful Captain, Faithful Pilot, Faithful Admiral, Faithful Comptroller, Faithful Purser, Faithful Scribe, Faithful Inner and Outer Sentinels, and 3 Faithful Trustees. The Color Corps Commander is appointed by the Faithful Navigator. As on the council level, the Fourth Degree has a State and Supreme Corps of Officers as well.

Dear Brother Sir Knights,

As Faithful Navigator of our assembly, I am inviting all Sir Knights to join me in recruiting one Fourth Degree Candidate for the Exemplification scheduled in Lakewood on Saturday, the 14th of April, 2012. Thus far I have but 2 candidates committed to receiving their Fourth Degree on that date: Jack Winslow and Fred Weisdepp.

Qualifications: In order to become a Fourth Degree member, you must first be a Third Degree member in good standing within the Council, and have been a Knight for a minimum of 6 months. You must also be an American citizen. A black tuxedo is generally worn by all Fourth Degree members for social events of a more formal nature and is a requirement for the Exemplification ceremony. The only exception to this is an active duty soldier may wear his dress uniform of the season for the ceremony.

As a member of the Fourth Degree, you may want to be a part of the Color Corps. The Regalia (Uniform) of the Fourth Degree – the cape, chapeau, sword and tuxedo were inspired by the naval officer's uniform of the late 1800's. The ceremonial sword is worn to signify

Christian Knighthood; to symbolize defense of Church, country and freedom and to show reverence for the Eucharist and respect for the clergy.

The various colors of the cape and chapeau denote official rank within the order:

- Red cape and white chapeau – Assembly member
- White cape and white chapeau – Faithful Navigator, past and present
- Purple cape and chapeau – Color Core Commanders
- Green cape and chapeau – District Marshalls
- Gold cape and chapeau – Masters, past and present
- Light blue cape and chapeau – Vice Supreme Masters, past and present
- Dark blue cape and chapeau – Supreme Master, past and present

Military Chaplain Scholarship Program

The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree of The Knights of Columbus is to instill and advance patriotism. One of our major goals for this year is to support The Military Chaplain Scholarship Program. The Military Archdiocese, which supplies Catholic Chaplains, estimates that it needs 800 priests to serve all the Catholic men and women in uniform today, but they are only able to supply 280 - barely a third of the number needed. Many Fourth Degree Knights of Columbus are veterans who served in combat and forward deployed areas. They appreciated having a Catholic Chaplain available, and would like to see those currently serving similarly supported. When you don't know whether each breath will be your last, spiritual guidance is high on your list of necessities.

The Knights of Columbus have established a new scholarship program, led by the Fourth Degree, to help fund the education of seminarians preparing to become Catholic chaplains. The program will contribute one million dollars to the Archdiocese for Military Services at a rate of \$ 200,000 per year for the next five years. Through this program, the Military Archdiocese contracts with each participating diocese to fund fifty percent of the cost of a seminarian's five year education. In return the candidate agrees that, following ordination and three years of service at a parish, he will commit to serve as a Military Chaplain for a minimum of three years.

Dr. King currently serves as a Pastoral Associate and Director of African-American Outreach for Priests for Life and Gospel of Life Ministries. She is also a voice for the Silent No More Awareness Campaign, sharing her testimony of two abortions, God's forgiveness, and healing.

The daughter of the late civil rights activist Rev. A.D. King and his wife Naomi Barber King, Alveda grew up in the civil rights movement led by her uncle, Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Her family home in Birmingham, Alabama, was

bombed, as was her father's church office in Louisville, Kentucky. Alveda was jailed during the open housing movement. She sees the prolife movement as a continuation of the civil rights struggle.

Dr. King is a former college professor and served in the Georgia State House of Representatives. She is a recipient of the Life Prize Award (2011), the Cardinal John O'Connor Pro-Life Hall of Fame Award (2011) from the Legatus organization and the Civil Rights Award from Congress of Racial Equality (CORE) (2011). She is a bestselling author; among her books are *How Can the Dream Survive if we Murder the Children?* and *I Don't Want Your Man, I Want My Own*. She is an accomplished actress and songwriter. The Founder of King for America, Inc., Alveda is also the recipient of an honorary Doctorate of Laws degree from Saint Anselm College and sits on the Board of Georgia Right to Life. She is also a member of the National Black Prolife Coalition, NBPC.

Dr. King lives in Atlanta, where she is the grateful mother of six and a doting grandmother.

Why is the Feast of the Annunciation so important to the pro-life movement?



In recent years perceptive pro-life parents began annual celebrations of their children's "First Days" nine months before their birthdays--recognizing that if every day practices don't reflect the reality of their beliefs they send destructively mixed message. Though many of them were faithful Christians, few of them recognized that Christ's "first day" passed by every year with no

celebration, virtually unnoticed by the majority of believers. And this was no ordinary "first day"--this was what Christians call the Incarnation--the moment God became man. As the word "incarnate" (to be made flesh) implies, this was fully accomplished not when Jesus reached adulthood, or was revealed to the world at his birth--it happened when he took on human flesh at his conception in Mary's womb. If the Christian community as a whole does not consistently recognize and honor the conception and prenatal life of Christ who is God, then it should come as no surprise that the secular world has so little regard for the newly conceived life of an "unplanned" child, who is neither divine nor anxiously awaited nor announced by angelic herald, but is simply unwanted, like so many others
