I just returned from our State Convention and our council was well represented. For the second year in a row, we have a Washington State Family of the Year from our council.

We were awarded the PFH certificate for meeting our goal and we were honored with the 1000 point pin. We placed 1st in the Tootsie Roll Program for total funds raised. Tom Pursley was awarded 2nd place for Top District in the Tootsie Roll Campaign. I can tell you, the other councils are gunning for us. I challenged the councils to come and get us and believe me, they are. Still not done.

I was fortunate enough to be one of 8 selected from Washington State to be a delegate to the Supreme Convention in Anaheim, CA August 3rd-7th. What an honor to be included as a delegate. This will be a busy summer, but I am looking forward to it.

R-74 is progressing, but slowly. As of this writing we are over 107,000 signatures and need another 43,000 by June 6th to secure an inclusion on the November ballot. Tom Hruska was able to get coverage over the weekend at Wal-Mart collecting another 300 signatures. Thanks to all who helped and for Darren Johnson's oversight. I pray to God that we will be successful.

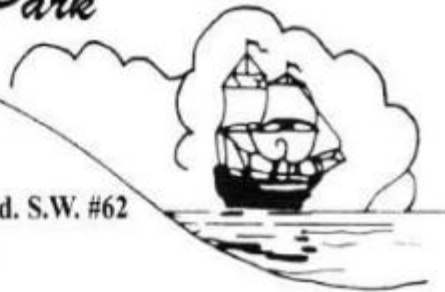

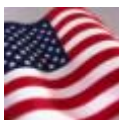

Note: Among them are abortion inducing drugs and procedures. ABC AND NBC CHOSE NOT TO COVER THIS NEWS.

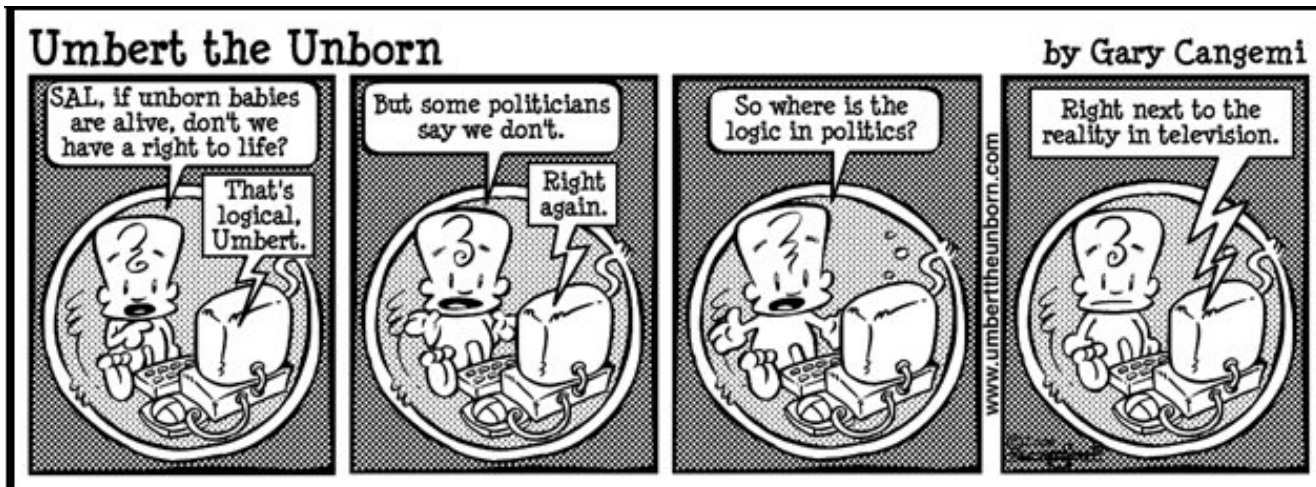


The Spirit of Truth

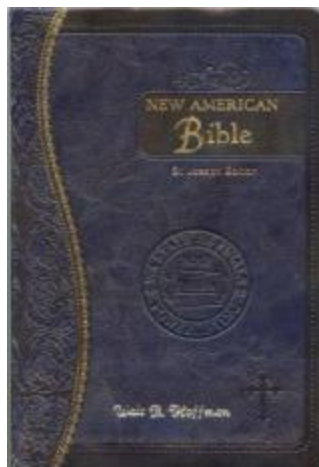
Bibles and Powerlifting

Our group bought 22 Bibles, they were imprinted on the cover with the seal of the state championship and each athlete (180) had his or her name embossed on the leather cover. Ron DeGroot and David Gedrose signed several Bibles each, and between Fr. Pat and Deacon Terry, they signed 35 Bibles, writing a personal message to each athlete.

My son Walt was one of the finalists who qualified for the state championship. He is 15 years old, a Squire, and an Altar Server at Sacred Heart. Walt came in 7th place in the state (out of the top 10), in

the 132 lb division, and was one of the only sophomores to qualify. The kid who came in 6th place will be 19 next month (Walt will be 16 next month). It was a lot of fun and we are very proud of all the hard work he did, lifting weights 4 days per week since November. The principal of Northwest Christian High School and Walt's coach told me this week that they received numerous e-mails, from kids and parents, thanking them for the Bibles. Kids



made comments like, "I have never even held a Bible before, I will treasure this gift". Remember, the majority of the Bibles went to kids from public schools from around the state.
