CAN YOU PRAY FOR VOCATIONS FOR JUST ONE HOUR?


Brother Knights,




Pastor Mark Driscoll: Science and Scripture Make it Clear Abortion is Murder

SHOW THE TRUTH WASHINGTON STATE REPORT



As you know Show the Truth traveled around Western Washington to schools and killing centers. Some of the highlights are shown. On Sunday, October 13, the youth gathered and

prayed for those they would be educating that week. On October 14 we visited a college and three killing centers in the Tacoma area, two of which perform later term abortions. Tuesday, Father Denis Wilde from Priests for Life, flew in from Texas and joined us at the main Planned Parenthood in Vancouver. We were blessed to have him with us, as now we would have Mass every day of our tour. Our efforts in educating the public always are more effective when we have Mass that day. On Wednesday we visited The Evergreen state University and the University of Washington. It is amazing how little these University students know about abortion and its effects, not only on the baby but the child's parents. We ended up in Bellingham where we over-nighted with 3 pro-life families who have supported us for over ten years. On Thursday we visited Whatcom Community College, Planned Parenthood, and Western University. Then it was off for the long ride home which included a stop for dinner. We were all pretty tired on arriving in

Olympia but not tired enough, for the youth stayed up talking well into the night. What a wonderful bunch of young people they are! On Friday Dani drove Father Denis to SeaTac for his trip back to Philadelphia, where he was scheduled that night for a talk. Father is in his 70s but his energy level is more like the teenagers! The rest of us joined in 40 Days for Life at Planned Parenthood in Olympia. PRAISE GOD! A baby's life was saved as well as the mother's spiritual well-being. The baby's father was nowhere to be found. So sad. It was then on to Centralia Community College and Centralia Planned Parenthood. Our closing was at a pro-life restaurant in Centralia where they had a special menu for those who do not eat meat on Fridays. Prayers were said and Thanksgiving for the day's we had together. Awards were given out to two young girls and a mother who were with us for the first time.

Thank you so much for all the prayers. Without them we would have been much less successful.
